How do I know if my Porcelain is worth anything?

A knowledge of these marks is also important if you are interested in determining the value of your china. Pottery marks are usually located on the bottom of a piece of pottery.

How do you identify a pottery Mark?

Most pottery marks consist of the manufacturer's name in some way, plus a design and/or porcelain trademark. Sometimes there is also an indication of a pattern, but on many items, these are replaced by a pattern name or number. The identification of pottery marks is a process of elimination.

What are the marks on Chinese porcelain?

How do I find out if a piece of pottery has been made?
