

How long is a car battery warranty?

Most manufacturers offer a warranty of around 36 months as standard. Some high-performance batteries may provide warranties extending to 60 months or more. Car battery warranties often vary based on the type of battery. For instance, traditional lead-acid batteries usually come with a warranty of three years.

What is a limited warranty EV battery?

Limited warranties provide coverage for a certain 'limited' duration, usually, this will be a combination of time and mileage. Just like with an EV charger warranty, if an EV battery fails because of manufacturing defects within the warranty period, then the car manufacturer should repair or replace it at no additional cost to the owner.

What does the warranty cover?

The guarantee covers any manufacturing defects which arise within the guarantee period. In the unlikely event you experience a problem with your battery, please return the battery to us along with proof of purchase. Nissan Leaf: Like Volkswagen, Nissan also provides a 3 years (or 60,000 miles) of manufacturer warranty, and the battery warranty is for 8 years (or 100,000 miles).
