

Do I need to remove a battery from my camera?

If your camera uses a different type of battery than the typical Li-Ion type found in most current cameras, then you would need to consider the battery type. Alkaline and older style Carbon ("Heavy Duty") batteries should be removed if you're not going to use the camera for more than a week or so.

Can you leave a battery film on?

Peel it off. It's a protective shipping covering. Leaving it on will cause the battery to retain more heat than it should. Was this answer helpful? You can leave it there. The film has no impact on the functionality of the batteries. Is just a transport protection. Was this answer helpful?

Is it OK to keep the battery in the camera?

Just want to make sure it's ok to keep the battery in the camera when it's laying on the desk. Cameras used to have a small secondary battery that kept the camera's clock running. But Canon has eliminated that battery on at least some of the newer cameras.

When should a camera battery be removed?

Alkaline and older style Carbon ("Heavy Duty") batteries should be removed if you're not going to use the camera for more than a week or so. Leaving them in for long periods can lead to corrosion leaking from the batteries and getting into your camera.

What happens if you leave a camera battery out?

Also there can be several random things that happen and will create problems with your camera. For instance, while you have left the camera somewhere and your cat spills water on it. Leaving the battery in will certainly destroy the circuits. If you keep the battery out, your camera will be saved.

Can a battery be recharged if a camera battery is empty?

A totally empty Li-Ion battery can not be recharged by most chargers. This is due to the increased risk of fire when applying voltage to such batteries. In most cases, it should take weeks for a battery to be drained that low. So there is no need to remove the battery each time you are done with the camera.

(If you do need to shelve it for a long time, the battery will be best if stored at a little less than half full.) ... remove the battery and store the camera in a cool, dry, well ...
